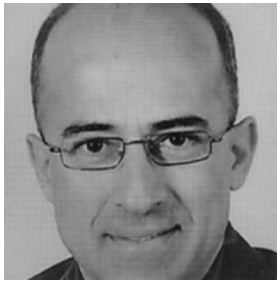

Lisa D. Iulo is an Associate Professor of Architecture and Director of the Hamer Center for Community Design at the Pennsylvania State University. Her research and creative accomplishments focus on building and planning for a more sustainable and resilient built environment. Lisa's work has been recognized in research and design related to residential green building and affordable housing, energy efficiency and strategies for the implementation of renewable energy at the building and community scale. With support from Penn State, NSF, and DOE, she has been working with students and colleagues to better understand the building/community relationships and opportunities where research, data and improved decision making can inform the design of resilient sustainable homes, buildings and communities. Lisa has been a member of the architecture faculty at the Penn State since 2003. Her teaching and research is closely linked with outreach and community engagement with a goal of facilitating collaboration across disciplines.

His research activities take on an interdisciplinary perspective and they focus on the areas of Integrated Architectural Design & Technology, Energy & Environmental Design of Buildings on Contemporary and Vernacular Architecture, Adaptable Building Envelope Design, Innovative & Sustainable Construction Components and Materials. He participated as principal investigator and/or project coordinator in several funded research programs. His work focused on energy and environmental architecture has won awards in architectural European and international competitions, including first prizes, and was presented in several architectural exhibitions in Cyprus and abroad. His research work has been published in books, refereed journals and conference proceedings.

Athina Papadopoulou



Athina received a Bachelor of Architecture from the University of Minnesota, USA (1990) and a Master's Degree in Architectural Conservation from the University of York, UK (1995). She has extensive experience in the field of architectural restoration working mainly from public sector positions. She joined the Nicosia Master Plan (NMP) team as conservation architect in 1999, actively participated in the conservation and rehabilitation projects of the NMP and is currently the Greek Cypriot NMP team Head since 2010. In 2005, as Lead Project Architect, she received the Europa Nostra First Prize in the "Restoration and Reuse" Category for the restoration of Omeriye Ottoman Baths. She is a member of the bicomunal Technical Committee on Cultural Heritage (TCCH) since its creation in 2008 until present. As member of the Nicosia Master Plan team, she was awarded the Aga Khan group prize for the Rehabilitation of The Walled City of Nicosia Project in 2007. Athina was President of the Cyprus Section of the International Council on Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS) during 2007-2016. In September 2021 the TCCH received the Europa Nostra Prize in the Category "Dedicated Service to Heritage by Organisations & Individuals" as well as the Grand Prix & Public Choice Award 2021.

Kiki Papasozomenou



Kiki Papasozomenou, originally from the village of Katokopia, was born in 1970 in the United Kingdom. He holds a degree in Piano teaching from the Hellenic Conservatory, a degree in Architecture from the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, and a master's degree in Business Administration (MBA) at the Cyprus International Institute of Management (CIIM) and holder of a Music Therapy Certificate from the Athens Opera Conservatory. He worked for many years (from 1993-2001) as a private Architect and as a collaborator of Architectural Offices of the private sector, at the Ministry of Defense, in studies -supervision-execution of execution contracts, a variety of different types of architectural projects (residential, multi-military projects, complexes, shops, industrial buildings, hotels, office buildings, historic buildings, etc.).
