1. Introduction


RMT3 aims to equip ESRs with the necessary skills to effectively communicate the knowledge gained through their research to non-academic organizations that they have been collaborating with. The course will focus on stakeholders involved in designing, planning, and providing sustainable and affordable housing.

Given the close relationship between RMT3 and TS3, both courses will run concurrently. The tasks in each course will be interconnected and complementary. Moreover, they will be aligned with the tasks outlined in WP4 Transdisciplinary Research Framework.

The course will draw on project results such as case studies, vocabulary, secondment reports, blog posts, publications, and ESR project summaries.

2. Course aims

The objectives of RMT3 are as follows:

- To introduce ESRs to various methods for effectively communicating research findings to non-academic stakeholders.
- To explore the applicability of different communication methods in the context of transdisciplinary research.
- To facilitate methodological linking of work carried out during secondments, ensuring that the results of each ESRs' research are communicated in a coherent and structured manner.
- To support the successful completion of individual research projects by helping ESRs to identify the most appropriate and effective ways to disseminate their findings to non-academic stakeholders.
- To promote cooperation and collaboration between ESRs to strengthen the research network across their individual projects and secondments.



 To strengthen the ability of ESRs to recognize connections between different tasks and work phases, ensuring that their research is conducted in a structured and coherent manner.

3. Learning outcomes

On the successful completion of the RMT3 module, ESRs will be able to demonstrate the following outcomes:

- Ability to engage with external stakeholders (non-academic sectors, local administrations, civic organizations), dealing with sustainable and affordable housing.
- An understanding the differences between the various communication methods to target specific non-academic groups.
- Ability to select the most suitable methods to communicate housing research findings from different disciplines to specific groups.
- Ability to position their own research results and those of other ESRs within the context of targeted stakeholders, ensuring that their findings are appropriately communicated and understood.
- Ability to prepare a transdisciplinary dissemination proposal, taking into account the needs and perspectives of all relevant stakeholders.
- A comprehensive understanding of the transdisciplinary approach to sustainable and affordable housing, including the importance of interdisciplinary collaboration, communication and engagement of the stakeholders involved.




