RE-DWELL "Delivering affordable and sustainable housing in Europe" has received funding from the European Union's Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under the Marie Skłodowska-Curie grant agreement No 956082

The workshop will enable participants to explore the connections between various disciplines and actors resulting from the research activities carried out in the project in different contexts, including individual research projects, secondments, and collaborative research activities (vocabulary, case studies). External Advisory Board members will participate in discussions regarding the necessity of taking a transdisciplinary approach to address sustainable and affordable housing. A joined activity of the courses "Research, Methods, and Tools" and "Transferable Skills" will focus on strategies and tools to facilitate communication and knowledge transfer between academic and non-academic actors. Site visits and lectures by local academics will provide insights into policy and funding strategies for providing affordable housing in the city of Zagreb.

## Tihomir Jukić



Tihomir Jukić, Ph.D. has been working at the Faculty of Architecture of the University of Zagreb as a full-time professor at the Department of Urban and Spatial Planning and Landscape Architecture where he contributes to all training courses and gives lectures in "Urban transformations". Besides pedagogical work he has been performing scientific and professional work. Either independently or in a team he led or participated in the making of over 50 professional projects – spatial and urban plans, detailed urban plans, landscape design and architectural projects. He has participated in urban and architectural competitions and won six first, one second and one third price.

## Montserrat Pareja-Eastaway



Montserrat Pareja-Eastaway, Ph.D. in Applied Economics from the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona, is Associate Professor of the Department of Economics at the University of Barcelona (UB). Since 1992, professor Pareja-Eastaway devotes her research to the analysis of urban problems and in particular, its impact on social, cultural and economic aspects. Multidisciplinary and comparative analyses are constant in her career together with her participation in professional projects in collaboration with public and / or private bodies, beyond academic research.

## Ashraf M. Salama



Ashraf M. Salama, Chair in Architecture and Urbanism, Head of Architecture and the Built Environment, University of Northumbria at Newcastle, and Former Head of the School of Architecture (2014-2020), Director of Research and of the Cluster for Research in Architecture and Urbanism in the Global South, since 2014, at University of Strathclyde, Glasgow, UK. His teaching, research, PhD supervision, and consulting have been focusing on sustainable architecture and urban design, with a strong emphasis on the impact of socio-cultural factors on shaping buildings and urban environments.

## Ana Vaz Milheiro



Ana Vaz Milheiro is Assistant Professor with Aggregation at the Faculty of Architecture at University of Lisbon (FAUL). Integrated PhD Researcher at DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE and researcher at African Studies Center at University of Porto. Chair of the Cost Action "European Middle-Class Mass Housing" (2019-23). Principal Investigator of five research projects focused on architecture and urban planning issues in the former Portuguese colonial African countries and middle-class housing, financed by the Foundation for Science and Technology, including the ongoing projects "Middle-Class Mass Housing in Europe, Africa and Asia" and "Dominance and mass-violence through Housing and Architecture during colonial wars".
